Community Outreach

The Outreach committee provided assistance for three veterans this year. These qualified individuals were in need of financial assistance and we were able to help each one. We all know that the cost of living continues to rise. As a result many of these veterans are experiencing difficult circumstances. We have helped veterans who need assistance with rent, electrical power cost, medical expenses, along with many other things.

You might ask how do we connect with these veterans. Well, we have a strong relationship with New Hanover County and Brunswick County along with other veteran organizations in our area. Most come through the county Veteran Service Officers. These VSO officers work everyday with veterans solving daily problems. SENCLAND MOAA with our Outreach program is a vital partner in helping these veterans in need.

We vet each applicant for eligibility. Each application must have a DD214 or documents confirming service time. We review "all " applications. The applications go to our committee for review. If we need more information I contact the VSO officer and clear the question. After the questions are answered, our three committee members continue reviewing the application. Each committee member then votes yes or no. Then we set a value of the grant; \$500 is the maximum awarded per person.

Our budget for 2026 started with \$2000. This money was donated by our members and we thank you for your donations. Every year the MOAA Foundation invites applications from Community Outreach programs. Our Chapter presented an application for 2026. The highest amount awarded is \$5000, so I asked for \$5000! We received \$2750! This amount along with the \$2000 starter, brings our budget to \$4750. We presented three grants of \$500 each, bringing our available balance to \$3250.

Legislative Affairs

In Washington



The White House proposed the fiscal 2027 budget on April 3, two months later than required by law. The President is requesting \$1.5 trillion for the Defense Department in fiscal 2027, a 44% increase from the already historic amount of nearly \$1 trillion requested in fiscal 2026. House and Senate Appropriations Committees are reviewing this request in preparation for drafting the FY 2027 DoD Appropriations Bills. A key House subcommittee advanced this draft bill to the full Appropriations Committee, where it faces an uncertain future. Similarly, the House and Senate Armed Forces Committees have completed work on the FY 2027 National Defense Authorization Act. The two versions will now be debated in the full House and Senate. So far, Committee versions of the NDAA include several MOAA legislative priorities. One of these would halt planned closures and cuts at 41 Military Treatment Facilities pending a comprehensive review of Defense Health Agency plans. MOAA and other Veterans Service Organizations have been busy testifying before these committees and the Veterans Affairs Committees in support of legislative priorities.

In North Carolina

The General Assembly has been busy reviewing the many new bills recently introduced as well as those carried over from the Long Session, including a few of military/retiree interest. So far most of these bills have been referred to committees for review. No legislations related to military or veterans' affairs have passed since last report. There has still been little progress on finalizing a budget for the 2025-26 Legislative Session.
